

Under 2's Activities

Colour Match



Resources Needed:

- A cardboard box
- Coloured balls
- Scissors
- Coloured pens
- Alternative cupcake tray with coloured paper

Duration:

Open ended, as long as children can keep their interest.

Intent:

Encourage children to match colours. Count 1,2,3. Putting the red ball in red hole or the blue ball in blue hole. Talk about the colours as you go along.

Implementation:

Cut holes in a cardboard box and use colour pens to create a ring around each hole. If you don't have a cardboard box you may use cupcake tray and coloured paper cutting the paper into circles to fit into the cupcake tray.

Extend:

You may also use Lego or coloured building blocks. You can count how many balls that are red or blue and introduce new colours for younger children.

Keywords and Language:

Numbers, individual colour names, throw, place, match, colour, counting.
